RESOLUTION NO. 97-6

A RESOLUTION SETTING FEES FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR CUTTING OF TOWNSHIP ROADS.

It is hereby resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Middlesex Township that the schedule of fees and charges for the issuance of permits for cutting of Township Road be established:

- (1) Application Fee - \$50.00
- (2) Supplemental Fee, for each 6-month time extension - \$10.00
- (3) General Permit Fees - calculation based on the total linear feet of the proposed opening. Amounts are per 100 feet (or fraction thereof) of road cut.
 - A. Opening in pavement - \$40.00
 - B. Opening in shoulder - \$20.00
 - C. Opening outside pavement and shoulder - \$10.00
- (4) Above Ground Facilities (poles, guys or anchors if installed)
 - A. Up to ten physically connected above ground facilities each continuous group - \$20.00
 - B. Additional above ground physically connected facilities, each pole with appurtenances - \$2.00
 - C. Crossings, overhead conveyors, pedestrian walk-ways or bridges - \$80.00
- (5) Exemptions - are not required from the following:
 - A. The Commonwealth
 - B. Political subdivisions of this Commonwealth
 - C. The Federal Government
 - D. The installation or maintenance of highway lighting at the request of the political subdivisions

SECTION 6: SPECIFICATIONS

All work to be done pursuant to a Permit shall be in strict conformance with the following standards, rules, regulations and specifications:

A. GENERAL STANDARDS

All materials and work to be performed within the limits of a Township Road shall be done in accordance with Pennsylvania Department of Transportation form 408 and Title 67, Pa. Code, Chapter 459.

B. RESPONSIBILITY

The PERMITTEE shall be responsible for failure of the highway surface during a period of two years following acceptance of the permanent resurfacing work on a Township Road. Any defects which become evident within the two-year period, such as settlement, cracks, deterioration of the surface, etc., must be repaired by removing the entire defective area and replacing it with new material in accordance with the appropriate following methods.

C. 90-DAY TEMPORARY RESTORATION METHOD

(1) Temporary Resurfacing

Where it is necessary to disturb the permanent surface of a Township Road, the trench shall be backfilled with 2-A modified stone a minimum of two inches below the surface of the existing roadway. The final two inches shall be filled with an asphaltic mix. The temporary resurfacing shall be well compacted with a ten-ton roller and must be started within 24 hours after the trench has been filled.

Cold patch may be used during the winter months when asphaltic hot mix is not available at the batch plant, or as determined by the board.

The Permittee shall continuously maintain the temporary paving to the satisfaction of the Engineer and the Township.

(2) Settlement Period

For a period of not less than 90 days nor more than 210 days, unless otherwise directed by the Board, the Permittee shall maintain the temporary resurfacing in a condition adequate for traffic and replace any settlement of the trench with additional resurfacing.

The Permittee shall pay any claims for damages arising from his neglect to properly maintain the backfilled and resurfaced trench.

D. EXISTING BITUMINOUS PAVEMENT

Restoration of existing bituminous pavements shall be done by the following method.

Prior to resurfacing, the existing pavement shall be sawed or cut in a neat straight line, at a distance of one (1') from the edge of the trench, to the bottom elevation of the existing base course. Drilling shall not be permitted. All loose material from the cutting shall be removed from the site.

At the expiration of the 90 day settlement period mentioned above, unless otherwise directed by the Board, the temporary resurfacing and the compacted trench fill shall be removed to a depth below the road surface sufficient to allow construction of the specified pavement courses. A bituminous concrete base course with a depth of 4 inches of ID2 binder and 1 1/2" of ID2 wearing shall be placed in this area. All replaced areas shall be compacted by the use of a ten-ton roller or vibrating compacting equipment giving the equivalent compaction of a ten-ton roller.

E. PAVED SHOULDER RESTORATION

At the expiration of the three months after installation, unless otherwise directed by the Board, the temporary restoration and the compacted trench fill shall be removed to a minimum depth of five inches (5") below the surface of the roadway. A bituminous concrete base course with a minimum depth of 4" shall be constructed and shall be topped with a 1" minimum of bituminous wearing course ID-2.

All Paved Shoulder Restoration shall be done in accordance with Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, Form 408.

All edges of the existing roadway surface disturbed during construction shall be cut in a straight line. Cutting of edges shall be done prior to placing of the wearing surface and shall be directed by the Board.

IMPORTANT

The terms and conditions embodied in this permit require the permittee to complete this work by the date specified in the permit. Where permittee fails to comply with the conditions as to completion of work by the time specified, the following rules will govern:

(a) **Failure to start work by date specified for completion.** Permit will be canceled unless permittee desires an extension of time, in which case a supplemental permit may be issued.

(b) **Work started and not completed by specified date.** Permittee will notify the Township, prior to expiration of allotted time, of inability to complete the work on or before the date specified and request an extension of time. Such request shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

(c) **Permittee not desirous of carrying out proposed work on account of change in conditions affecting it.** Permittee will notify the Township prior to the date specified for completion that work will not be carried forward, returning the permit with such notice. The fee for inspection of the work will be refunded by the Township, provided that they have been notified of cancellation prior to the expiration date. The fees to be paid under conditions in (a), (b), and (c) apply only to permits for which fees are collected in accordance with the fixed schedule.

All notices relative to time extensions or cancellations shall be forwarded to the Township which issued the original permit.
